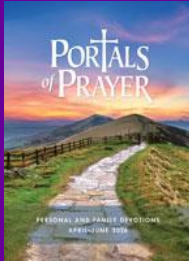


Stewardship Corner

Dear Saint Trinity Evangelical Lutheran Church,

I pray all is well with you and yours! My family is doing quite well back home in Sarasota, but they miss having me home and I am missing them, too. Everything is well with me at the seminary, but I must admit that I am anxious to receive my vicarage placement and learn more about the areas I need to grow in. A bird told me that there are six Florida vicarages this year, pray that I get one! After spending the past couple of years in St. Louis, I've realized that I struggle with snow, so here's hoping that I don't get a placement in Anchorage (beautiful place, just too much snow)! On a lighter note, our snowfall this year in St. Louis has fit much better into the "norm" for the area, I'm told. Even so, some more heat would be nice. Can you tell that I'm missing home?

My coursework has also been progressing quite well. This semester, we were treated to a course covering LCMS history, a course on pastoral care, a course on preaching that includes work with Greek and Hebrew, as well as a systematics course on the relationship between Church and world.
