The men's softball league begins Monday, May 6, 2024. St. Trinity practices are on Monday's in April: last practice is the 29th at 6:30 pm.



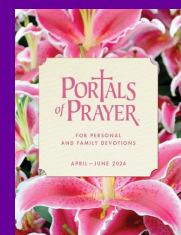
