What is Truth?





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Easter Recipe from the Ashley's

Many asked about my recipe for the Oatmeal Breakfast Bars made for the Easter Breakfast. Thank you for their kind compliments concerning the baked goods.

Raspberry Oatmeal Bars

3/4 C. Butter or Margarine

1 C. packed Brown Sugar

1 1/2 C. Flour

1 t. Salt

□ 1/2 t. Soda

1 1/2 C quick Oats uncooked

1 10 oz. jar of Raspberry Preserves, or your choice or combination.

Cream Butter and Sugar until light and fluffy. Add combined dry ingredients and mix well. Lightly spray a 13" x 9" pan with Pam. Then press half of the crumb mixture on bottom of pan. Spread with preserves of choice; Sprinkle remaining crumble mixture overall, lightly press.

Bake in preheated 400-degree oven for 20 - 25 minutes.

Cool and cut into bars.

Note to fans. The preserve or jam or jelly you chose will spread better if its room temp and stirred up a little. Also try adding some dry/powdered peanut butter to the crumble for a fun twist and protein. This freezes well, if you don't leave it open prey on the counter too long.
