Thankful For Meaning and Purpose

When we, using our own reason, attempt to understand the meaning and purpose of life, inevitably the conclusion is dire.

Whether it is contemplations in the Book of Ecclesiastes or Albert Camus' interpretation of the Myth of Sisyphus, the conclusion is the same: life has no meaning and no purpose.

We are left to find meaning in the material world and to seek to satisfy our own desires. However, it does not take long to conclude that even pleasure is *meaningless*, *meaningless*.

The Word of God provides a very different formula for finding meaning in life, and one that is contrary to human logic. Instead of looking to please oneself, look to please God and look to the interests of others.

God's logic, indeed, His instructions, make no sense to our (finite) minds. Yet, it is true. Research consistently shows that selfless individuals are happier and have better social relationships.

The book of Philippians (2:4) told us centuries ago to look to the interests of others.

James 1:27 tells us to look after the orphans and widows.

The book of Chronicles (29:14) reminds us that everything comes from God and that we should give generously.

God orders our entire life: Work is God ordained (Genesis 2:15), He puts our very bodies in perspective, a temple of the Holy Spirit (1 Corinthians 6:19), and assigns value to the unborn (Psalm 119:73).

As the world is increasingly lost and souls search for meaning, it is incumbent on us, *saints of God*, to share the Good News. Life has meaning only in God.

In this season of thanks, let's pause and **truly appreciate the Word of God and His love for us**. While the world tries to convince us that they know how to find happiness and contentment, thank God that He tells us where true fulfillment is found.
